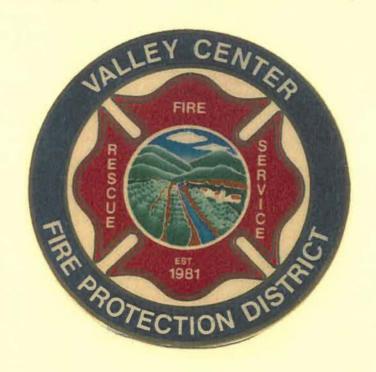

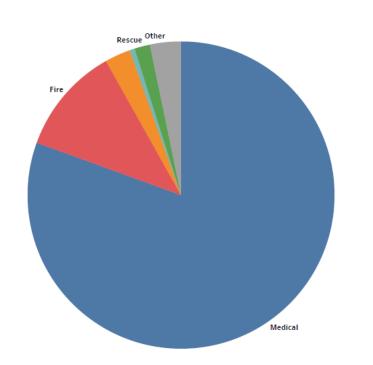

Administrative Services and Community Risk Reduction Division Board Report

for the month of January 2024

Section 0 - Staff report on California Class

Administrative Division Staff has reviewed the option of investing in California CLASS as directed by the Board in the last meeting.

As the Board is aware, our funds held at the County earn a 1% per annum interest rate, guaranteed by the County. California CLASS offers two investment options, "Enhanced Cash" and "Prime". The "Enhanced Cash" option is touted as the lower risk of the two.

This is copied directly from the FAQs on the California Class website. The highlighting is mine:

Q. What are the risks of investing in a product like California CLASS Enhanced Cash?

A. Investing involves risks including the possible loss of principal. The investment decisions made by California CLASS Enhanced Cash are subject to certain risks and such decisions may not always be profitable. California CLASS Enhanced Cash does not guarantee returns or performance against stated benchmarks. Past performance is not a guarantee of future results. Many factors affect performance including changes in market conditions and interest rates and in response to other economic, political, or financial developments. The following is a summary of common risks associated with investing in a product like California CLASS Enhanced Cash.

Staff does not recommend this investment at this time due to the potential risk of principal loss.

Section 1 - Administrative Services Report

Unrestricted Fund Balances

This section describes the state of the property tax accounts at the county, and our bank accounts. The county funds are commonly referred to as "oracle" accounts. These accounts are the basis for our general operating funds, and can be used as needed without restriction. Accrual based, meaning these are the bank balances minus any outstanding payments like uncashed checks. This is a snapshot of the accounts on 2/6/2024.

Expected Expenses in February

This section outlines the expected big expenses in the coming months that will be paid out of unrestricted funds.

- Payroll runs about \$230,000 per month (26 pay periods per year, so there are two
 months [March and September] that are \$345,000). This amount varies with overtime.
- Expenses expected to be between \$80k and \$100k.
- Quarterly payroll taxes in February (~\$29,000.00). Next one will be in May.
- Litigation Expenses are running approx \$2000/month

Restricted fund balances

This section is the restricted fund balances. These funds are restricted in their usage, and cannot be used for general expenses. In the case of mitigation funds, they can only be used for apparatus, equipment and facilities upgrades (not maintenance). Grant monies can only be used within the requirements of the grants.

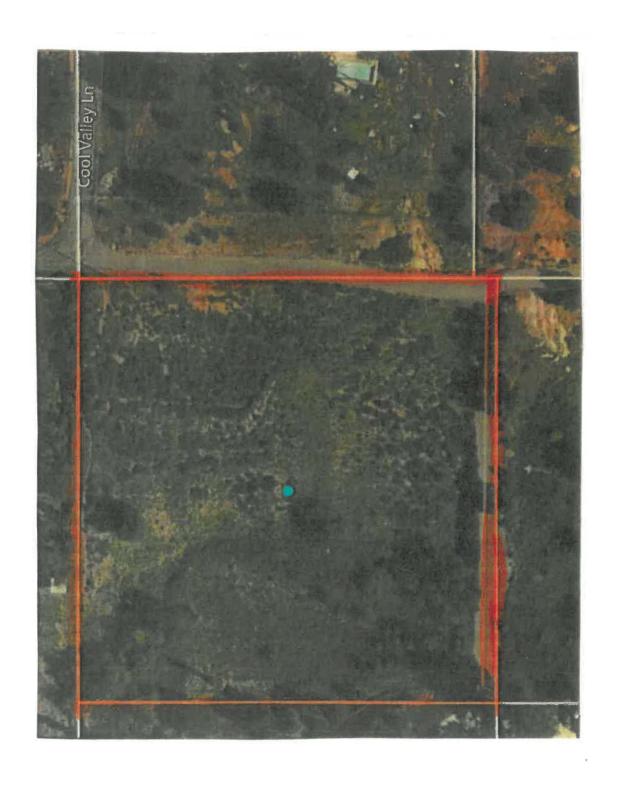

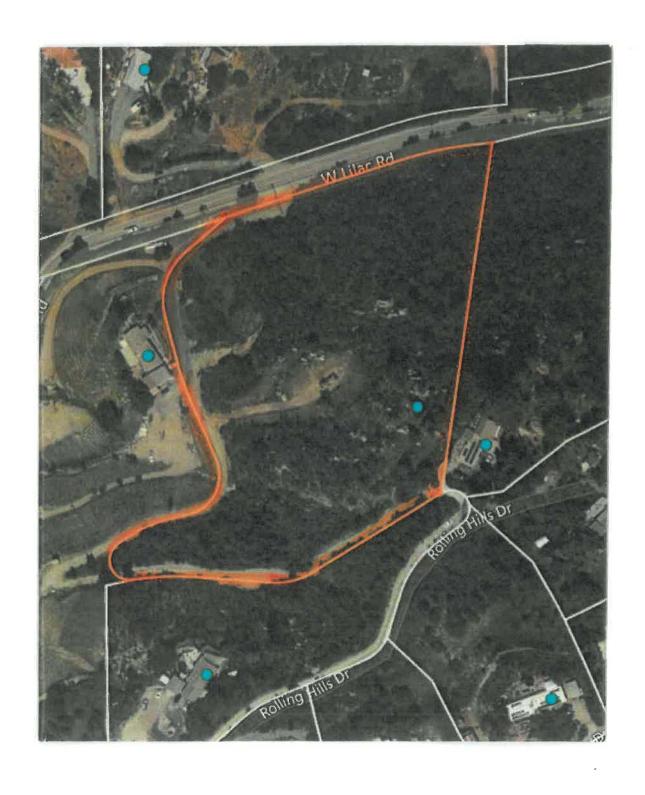

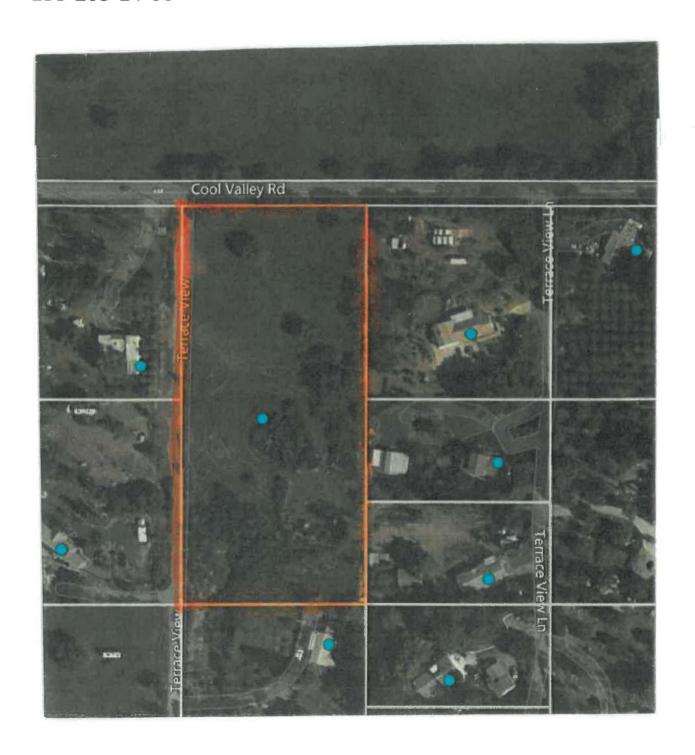

All statements will be retained by the Valley Center Fire Protection District for the term they serve the District plus 2 years.

In addition, this code does not establish any disclosure obligation for any designated employees who are designated in a conflict of interest code for another agency, if all of the following apply:

- (A) The geographical jurisdiction of this agency is the same as or is wholly included within the jurisdiction of the other agency;
- (B) The disclosure assigned in the code of the other agency is the same as that required under article 2 of chapter 7 of the Political Reform Act, Section 87200; and the filing officer is the same for both agencies.
- (C) Such persons are covered by this code for disqualification purposes only. With respect to all other designated employees, the disclosure categories set forth in the Appendix, Exhibit A, specify which kinds of economic interests are reportable. Such a designated employee shall disclose in his or her statement of economic interests form 700, those economic interests he or she has which are of the kind described in the disclosure categories to which he or she is assigned in the Appendix, Exhibit A. It has been determined that the economic interests set forth in a designated employee's disclosure categories are the kinds of economic interests which he or she foreseeably can affect materially through the conduct of his or her office.

Dear Assemblymember Juan Carrillo,

Valley Center Fire Protection District, representing Valley Center, CA, is pleased to support AB 1819 (Waldron), which will give local governments an additional tool to mitigate wildfires. High and veryhigh fire risk severity zones face longer, more intense, and increasingly hazardous wildfires. Having the option of an enhanced infrastructure financing district for wildfire mitigation will help fund these efforts without the need to raise taxes.

Special districts, cities, and counties currently can choose to participate in an Enhanced Infrastructure Financing District (EIFD) to help fund critical infrastructure and other local projects. AB 1819 explicitly allows EIFDs to invest in essential tools and equipment for wildfire mitigation, including heavy equipment to clear vegetation, create firebreaks, harden utility infrastructure against wildfires, and obtain air resources and new technologies for firefighting and prevention.

The Valley Center Fire Protection District is approximately 85 square miles in size and consists of a high value agricultural presence, rolling chaparral covered hillsides of open space intermixed with areas of larger acreage single-family country estate homes. There are several clusters of housing tract-style homes with more being built and planned that create our urban wildland interface areas. Our community has experienced the devastation of wildfire with loss of life and property during the 2003 Paradise Fire and 2007 Poomacha Fire in which the entire community was evacuated.
